Dear Student:

Thank you for your interest in the New Vision programs offered at Wayne Technical and Career Center. These programs are designed for high school seniors interested in pursuing a career in health care or health sciences. Each program provides a "new vision" of applied academics and career education.

New Vision students spend half of each school day engaged in a unique educational experience at WTCC and/or a local health care facility. During the year long program students are exposed to a rigorous college preparatory curriculum and have the opportunity to experience a number of different internships/rotations working directly with professionals in their field of study. They have the opportunity to see firsthand many of the career opportunities available in their chosen field of study. Upon successful completion of a New Vision program, students receive four units of credit toward NYS High School graduation, as well as potential Gemini credit through our partnership with Finger Lakes Community College.

If you would like to be considered for entrance into one of these programs, you must:

- 1. complete the enclosed application
- 2. write a personal essay based on one of the topics listed on the application
- 3. have your transcript forwarded to Wayne Technical and Career Center (WTCC)
 - *Your transcript should show Q2 grades, current Q3 grades, attendance to date & class rank (if your district ranks students)
- 4. be recommended by your high school counselor (recommendation form enclosed)
- 5. have one English, Math or Science faculty member complete and return a teacher recommendation form (enclosed)
- 6. provide an updated resume 'listing: any relevant volunteer experience as well as any work experience/history, sports, clubs, and other extra-curricular activities

Please note that all materials must be received at the Wayne guidance office by **Friday, March 22, 2019**. Following this deadline the admissions committee will meet and decisions regarding acceptance will be mailed via USPS the week of April 22nd, 2019. New Vision Health Therapy Science

Program Goal:

Exercise Science is becoming one of the fastest growing college majors and occupational areas in the health and medical industry. Both theory and hands-on experience are introduced in this exciting program. The Health Therapy Sciences Program is designed to provide high school seniors the opportunity to intensely investigate future college and professional career options within the fields of medicine, wellness and fitness and effectively prepare them for the rigors of college/university level study.

Course Description:

This course is designed around the traditional "New Vision" model of career exploration. It is, however, very different in the breadth of college level credit offered. This course will allow students to explore, learn and examine concepts, material and procedures in the areas of Anatomy & Physiology, Nutrition, Exercise Science and English in a truly integrated model. This is intended to give the dedicated student a look into the areas of healthcare based on movement, exercise and nutrition. Through the lens of in-depth study and vocational discovery come enhanced career and college focus.

The foundational course will be Human Anatomy & Physiology I and II. This is a very challenging study of the structure and function of the human body. A&P is a healthcare essential course that is a pre-requisite for further study. Virtually all subject areas of the NVHTS curriculum are rooted in Anatomy & Physiology. As a result, transition and integration to all other areas will be natural and seamless.

Introduction to Nutrition is another essential course that is vital to a career in healthcare. It exposes the student to the field of human nutrition and food focused on the mutual relationships between humans and their biological and physical environment.

The ability to effectively read, write, speak and perform research are necessary skills demanded in the area of healthcare. English Composition 101 and 103 will challenge the students in these all important areas. The integration of English into the curriculum will be natural, relevant and again seamless.

Five career exploration rotations will be completed during the course of the school year. Each rotation will be one day per week for three weeks. Career areas will be chosen by the instructor and student after thorough discussions of student interest. Rotations will take place in area hospitals, affiliated clinics, private practices, and area colleges. There will be additional opportunities to refine one's career choice in the form of field trips and guest speakers throughout the year.

We will be seeking an affiliation with area institutions in order to give us access to personnel, departments, speakers and tours among other opportunities. This added benefit affords greater opportunity and networking.

Upon successful completion of New Vision Health Therapy Sciences, students have the opportunity to earn 12 college credits as follows:

Organization:

Due to the expansive nature of the curriculum, the schedule will be fluid and reactive to educational opportunity as it arises. Much time will be spent in the classroom/lab area where lecture and most laboratory experiences will take place. A significant amount of time will be spent in our new wellness center making classroom concepts come to life. Anatomy & Physiology will consume a majority of the student's time (approximately 3 days/week, not in succession and not the same days every week). Nutrition will comprise approximately 1 day/week). It is anticipated that approximately 2 hours/week will be spent in our wellness center extending and exploring classroom learning. As a result of the schedule flexibility, outstanding attendance is imperative and expected.
